



I am thrilled to extend a warm invitation to you to delve into the insights of our detailed Annual Report for the year 2023.



## ENDING GENDER BASED VIOLENCE

The project was dedicated to ending Gender
Based Violence (GBV) specifically Sexual Based
Violence (SBV) targeting adolescent girls aged
15 to 17 who are in 10 both primary and
secondary schools, and who are out of school.
This initiative combines awareness-raising
campaigns, comprehensive education on
consent, gender equality, and respectful
relationships. Through empowerment
workshops and access to counseling services,
the project aims to equip 1550 young girls with
the knowledge and confidence to speak out
against violence and protect their rights.

- **Youth-Friendly Spaces** and **Environment: Supportive** safe Creating and vouthfriendly spaces for AGYW to have the confidence to seek support, and access health, rights, and welfare social services was another kev accomplishment.
- Empowering AGYW as Agents of Change, we successfully recognized AGYW as agents of change, and involving them in the design and implementation of our programs proved to be crucial. When AGYW had a voice and active participation in decision-making processes, the initiatives were more relevant, sustainable. and impactful because the initiatives focused on improving their lives directly so it was easy for them to speak on their own



#### Stakeholders meeting at Sumbawanga village district

- 780 people were reached where 40 are members from the 3 existing women and child protection committees (MTAKUWWA) which draws its membership from the religious group; police gender desk, health workers, education institutions, local government leader, women representative and youth representatives and 740 are AGYW from the 5 wards of the implementation.
- Trained 5 conducted which areAdolescent airls round table discussion 80 AGYW trained, Girls 150 **AGYW** symposium trained. Adolescent Health forum 240 AGYW trained, Establishment of youth club 80 AGYW trained. and during sport Bonanza 100 AGYW trained.
- Community Engagement and Empowerment: we successfully involved actively with communities like local leaders, elders, school teachers, health care providers, and influential and other local organizations to raise awareness and challenge harmful social norms and practices that affected AGYW. School-based negatively interventions and youth-led advocacy programs played a vital role in empowering AGYW to assert their rights, access opportunities, and make informed decisions about their lives.

#### **KEEPING GIRLS IN SCHOOL**

#### Increasing girls access to safe and sustainable reusable sanitary pads to increase school attendance

The project aimed at increasing awareness of Menstrual health and rights to reduce school dropout and absenteeism, and increase the performance of girls students in 5 secondary schools of Sumbawanga District Council. The project involves an activity of distributing reusable sanitary pads that are safe, accessible, affordable, and sustainable. Through this project, we achieved to help more than 1100 girls to stay in school and for the girls who are out of school to know MHM. The project achieved to increase awareness around MHM and advancements in education and healthcare.

#### **OUT OF SCHOOL GIRLS**

We conducted a Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) training for 100 out-of-school girls in Mpui ward. The training aimed to empower these young girls with essential knowledge and skills related to menstrual hygiene. We covered topics such as proper menstrual hygiene practices, the use of sanitary products, and the importance of personal hygiene during menstruation. The interactive session provided a safe and supportive environment for the girls to ask questions and share their experiences. By the end of the training, the girls were better informed and equipped to manage their menstrual health confidently. Three out-of-school girls were trained to sew reusable sanitary pads, contributing to their overall well-being and empowerment.




#### **INCOME FOR THE YEAR 2023**


